RESOURCES REQUIRING PUBLIC LIBRARY CARDS

Access all of these resources through your local public library website. While they require a library card for use, we hope you will encourage their use by your students and reach out to your public library to work on getting cards for all students. [Find your local public library](#).

- **Access Video Just for Kids:** Authenticated by referring url from your local public library. Enjoy TV shows like Arthur, Sesame Street, as well as “read along” storybooks and so much more. Explore topics like reading, writing, math, arts and science.
- **Homework HelpNow:** Available seven days a week, 2 pm to 11 pm. Connect LIVE with a certified teacher for assistance with homework (k-college), research and writing. A public library card will be needed to access some of the content. This platform is currently available until **September 30, 2024**.
- **Novelist Plus** and **Novelist Plus K-8:** Readalike lists, author information, series lists, and more. A treasure trove of resources for readers of all ages.
- **Transparent Language Online:** Study over 120+ foreign languages including over 20 indigenous languages and American Sign Language, as well as ESL/ELL classes in 34 languages and Citizenship Prep – self-paced learning.
- **Universal Class:** a diverse self-paced online learning experience from academic to hobby to business skills. Algebra, basic grammar, calligraphy, civics, and more
